1. INTRODUCTION

Belarusian policy in the area of international technical assistance (ITA) is defined, in particular, in the National Programmes for International Technical Cooperation (NP ITC).

National priorities within the NP ITC are based on the principles of sustainable social and economic development and targeted at forming a powerful national economy, carrying out social reforms leading to an increased level of prosperity, raising the level of environmental protection to overcome the effects of the Chernobyl disaster.

The regular five-year NP ITC programmes are drafted in accordance with national priorities based on the proposals submitted by the relevant central public administration bodies, Oblast and Minsk City Executive Committees as well as other institutions and organizations.

The current NP ITC covers the period 2012-2016¹. This programme is based on the Programme of Social and Economic Development of Belarus for 2011-2015 and the National Strategy of Sustainable Social and Economic Development of Belarus for the period till 2020.

Priorities of international technical cooperation for the Republic of Belarus for the period of 2012-2016 are as follows:

- Development of human resources, initiative and entrepreneurship;
- Effective governance and improved public services;
- Ecological sustainability;
- Regional development.

Priorities of the Government Programmes for the period of 2012-2016 are also seen as ITA priorities.

According to the NP ITC for 2012-2016 the overall needs of Belarus in ITA for this period are more than USD 400 million. According to the Programme of Social and Economic Development of Belarus for 2011-2015 the annual ITA should amount to between USD 50 -70 million for this period.

The European Union (EU) is the most important ITA multilateral donor in Belarus. The overall volume of EU external assistance available in 2007-2013 for the ENP countries is over EUR 11 billion², and the potential estimated share for Belarus could be as high as EUR 400 million - EUR 500 million. This means that the EU alone may satisfy the needs of Belarus in ITA.

2. EU EXTERNAL ASSISTANCE INSTRUMENTS AVAILABLE TO BELARUS

EU external assistance to partner states has been programmed for a period of seven years starting from 2007. The implementation period of the current NP ITC falls into two programming periods: 2007-2013 and 2014-2020.

In the period of 2007-2013 EU ITA to Belarus is provided through several external assistance instruments. Six out of nine of these instruments are available to Belarus. These are:

- 1) European Neighborhood and Partnership Instrument (ENPI);
- 2) Instrument for Nuclear Safety Co-operation (INSC);
- 3) Instrument for Stability (IFS);
- 4) Macro-Financial Assistance Instrument (MFA);
- 5) Instrument for Humanitarian Aid (IHA);
- 6) European Instrument for Democracy and Human Rights (EIDHR).

The Instrument for Pre-Accession (IPA) and the Instrument for Development Cooperation are not available to Belarus.

Within the Development Cooperation Instrument (DCI) the following Thematic Programmes are available to the ENPI countries, including Belarus:

- Investing in People (IiP);
- Migration and Asylum (M&A);
- Environment and Sustainable Management of Natural Resources Including Energy (ESMNRI);
- Non-State Actors and Local Authorities in Development (NSA-LA);
- Food Security (FS),

The main instrument to provide EU ITA to Belarus till 2013 is the ENPI. Within the ENPI the following programmes are available to Belarus:

- ✓ National Programme.
- ✓ Regional (Eastern) Programme (EP).
- ✓ Inter-Regional Programme (IRP), including
 - TAIEX,
 - CUIDAD,
 - ERASMUS MUNDUS,
 - TEMPUS.
- ✓ Cross-Border Cooperation Programmes (CBC), including
 - Baltic Sea Region (BSR),
 - Latvia-Lithuania-Belarus (L-L-B),
 - Poland-Belarus-Ukraine (P-B-U).

- ✓ CBC within the Eastern Partnership (EaP). Building the capacities of the local and regional authorities for their participation in the EaP CBC within the Ukraine-Belarus Programme (U-B) (*including Brest and Gomel Oblasts of Belarus and Volyn, Rivno, Zhytomir, Chernigov Oblasts and northern part of Kyiv Oblast of Ukraine*).

3. USE OF EU EXTERNAL ACTION INSTRUMENTS IN THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE NP ITC

2012 is a year of transition in which resources for the main cooperation programmes for the period 2007-2013 having already been committed (see Table 1), while the allocation of resources for the next programming cycle of 2014-2020, has not yet begun, although the main instruments for this period have already been defined by the European Commission (see Table 2).

As it is shown in Table 2, Belarus may benefit from the following EU external action instruments in 2014-2020:

1. IHA;
2. IFS;
3. INSC;
4. EIDHR ;
5. European Development Fund (EDF);
6. DCI (only thematic programmes);
7. European Neighborhood Instrument (ENI).

This is practically the same set of instruments which is being used within the current financial framework of 2007 - 2013.

The main instrument for Belarus within the programming cycle for 2014-2020 will be the European Neighborhood Instrument (ENI), which will replace the ENPI. Information published by the European Commission (until September 2012) allow us to compare these two instruments, and conclude, that the ENI is very similar in its structure to the ENPI. This means that the main programmes currently in progress will continue to operate in 2014-2020, i.e.

- National Programme.
- Regional (Eastern) Programme (EP).
- Inter-Regional Programme (IRP):
 - ✓ TAIEX;
 - ✓ CUIDAD.
 - ✓ ERASMUS MUNDUS;
 - ✓ TEMPUS;
- Cross-Border Cooperation Programmes (CBC):
 - ✓ Baltic Sea Region (BSR);
 - ✓ Latvia-Lithuania-Belarus (L-L-B);
 - ✓ Poland-Belarus-Ukraine (P-B-U).
- DCI:
 - ✓ IIP;
 - ✓ MaA;
 - ✓ ESMNRI;
 - ✓ NSA-LA;
 - ✓ FS.

Some programmes may be renamed, there may be a few more or a few less programmes but their character and priorities should remain the same as in the ENPI. This allows us to anticipate the potential use of the various EU instruments for the implementation of the NP ITC.

Therefore, for the implementation of the NP ITC Belarus may use EU financial allocations from 2013, the EaP CBC Programme (see Table 1) and all funds available to Belarus within the EU external action instruments for 2014-2020 (see Table 2).

4. CURRENT USE OF EU EXTERNAL ASSISTANCE INSTRUMENTS IN THE IMPLEMENTATION THE NP ITC

Currently seven projects included in the ITC National Programme (for the total amount of EUR 20.63 million) are financed from EU external assistance instruments:

- 4 projects within the ENPI CBC programme Poland-Belarus-Ukraine;
- 2 projects within the ENPI CBC programme Latvia-Lithuania-Belarus;
- 1 project within the ENPI National Action Programme (currently in the last stage of endorsement) (see Annex).

This amounts to 6.14%³ of all the projects included in the NP ITC or 6.52%⁴ of the total NP ITC budget.

5. PERSPECTIVES TO THE USE OF EU EXTERNAL ASSISTANCE INSTRUMENTS FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF NP ITC PROJECTS

5.1. 2007 - 2013 Programming cycle

Programming of EU assistance within this cycle is complete. Programming continues for the National Action Programme 2013 and the launching of the EaP CBC programme. Re the Thematic Programmes a call for proposals could be launched for the Non-State Actors/Local Authorities programme.

ENPI

National Programme

National Annual Action Programme 2012⁵

The EU Delegation is planning to launch a EUR 5 million project entitled 'Mobility Scheme for Targeted People-to-People Contacts (MOST)' in the near future. This project is a scheme designed to facilitate direct people-to-people contacts between representatives from the spheres of culture, education & youth and science & technology in the Republic of Belarus and their counterparts in Member States of the European Union. (While these core sectors are the priority, other appropriate sectors may be also considered, e.g. social affairs, public health, information society, etc, depending on the demand from the Beneficiary.) The contacts will be established and/or developed during short visits by the Belarusian representatives to the EU and by EU representatives to Belarus for activities such as study tours, international professional events, internships, exchange visits, networking events, joint project elaboration, etc.

This project may finance the following project proposals from the NP ITC: No's 17, 103, 104, 107, 108 and 109.

National Annual Action Programme 2013

From 04 to 06 July 2012 a special EC identification mission visited Minsk to draft the NAAP-2013 for Belarus.

The identification mission tentatively selected the following sectors to be supported within the ENPI NAAP in 2013:

- Regional development (Minsk and Vitebsk Oblasts);
- Forestry;
- Energy effectiveness;
- Standardization (assistance to the National Authority for Labs Certification).

Three project proposals from the NP ITC could be financed from the NAAP-2013: No 64, Development of the certification infrastructure in Belarus according to the Best Accreditation Practice in the EU (Gosstandard); No 91, Raising Energy Effectiveness of Residential Buildings in the Republic of Belarus (Department of Energy Effectiveness of the Gosstandard); and No 92, Development of Wind Energy Production in Belarus (Department of Energy Effectiveness of the Gosstandard). The overall estimated amount for these three project proposals is EUR 7,840,000 (see Annex).

The Ministry of Forestry or Minsk and Vitebsk Oblasts have not submitted their project proposals for the NP ITC.

EaP CBC programme

The EaP CBC programme was scheduled to start in late 2012 – early 2013. This programme has two components:

- ✚ Component 1: Capacity building of local and regional authorities (LRA) for their participation in the EaP CBC programme

- ✚ Component 2: mainly includes the Ukraine-Belarus (U-B) programme (*including Brest and Gomel Oblasts of Belarus and Volyn, Rivno, Zhytomir, Chernigov Oblasts and the northern part of Kyiv Oblast of Ukraine*).

The Component 2 priorities are as follows:

- ✓ Upgrading the quality of life of the local communities in the cross-border regions through implementation of joint social and economic projects;
- ✓ Cooperation in the areas of joint interest (such as environment, employment, health care or any other);
- ✓ People-to-people contacts.

Component 2 of this programme could finance five project proposals from the NP ITC: Nos. 102, 103, 104, 108 and 109 amounting to a total of EUR 330,000.

According to the conditions of the EaP CBC Programme, it may only finance local initiatives and therefore a wide range of project proposals from NP ITC directed at improvements and provision of facilities at Belarus-Ukraine border (No. 24, 26, 32-36, 52 and 59) remain ineligible. Border Management remains one of the EaP CBC programme priorities. But this priority does not foresee financing of projects on border management with non-EU states. This means that at least within the 2007-2012 programming cycle implementation of such projects is unlikely (No. 24-26, 32-36, 52 and 59. See Annex).

Thematic Programme NSA-LA.

Thematic programmes are complementary to geographic programmes. The NSA-LA programme provides direct support to civil society and local authorities. Resources from this programme can be accessed worldwide, including from all EaP countries. Allocations of EUR 3,150,000 have been made for local authorities in all EaP countries over the 2011-2013 period, except for Azerbaijan. The programme takes the form of single-country and multi-country interventions which aim to:

- strengthen participatory development and processes and include all actors, especially vulnerable and marginalised groups;
- support capacity development processes of the actors concerned at country, regional or local level;
- promote mutual understanding processes;
- facilitate the active engagement of citizens in development processes and strengthen their capacity to take action.

EUR 250,000 was made available to local authorities in Belarus for the 2011-2012 period, identifying specific local authority objectives including empowerment, democratisation and the promotion of citizen participation⁶.

The NP ITC project proposals Nos. 07-15 and 18-21 could be financed from this programme (see Annex).

5.2. 2014 - 2020 Programming cycle

ENI

In this programming cycle the major instrument for NP ITC implementation will be the ENI.

National Programme.

Priorities of the National Programme for 2014-2020 have not yet been defined. This is why it is difficult to make a forecast. However, judging by current NP ITC project proposals it would appear that those with the

best chance of success are proposals Nos. 91 and 92 (see Annex) and proposals Nos. 19 and 20, if they receive proper support from the Ministry of Education.

The NP ITC proposal No 1, 'Prophylactics and Treatment of HIV/AIDS in the Republic of Belarus-3' could be financed jointly by the UN and the EU through the ENI.

Regional Programme.

Priorities of the Regional Programme for 2014-2020 have not yet been defined. But we may assume that they will not be substantially different from those of the current ENPI Regional Programme. And most likely they will be as follows:

- networks (transport and energy);
- environment;
- border management (customs, migration, combating international crime);
- person-to-person contacts;
- distruction of arms and ammunition,

i.e. basically the areas of joint interest to the ENI Regional Programme participant states.

This is why NP ITC project proposals Nos. 27, 30, 53, 55, 57, 58, 61 and 65 (see Annex) could be financed through the ENI RP.

Inter-Regional Programme

We assume that Belarus will continue to benefit from EU programmes such as TAIEX, Erasmus-Mundus and TEMPUS. Perhaps in the future Belarus will become eligible for other EU instruments like SIGMA and TWINNING, which currently are not available to Belarus, due to the current political situation.

TAIEX

A number of NP ITC proposals may be financed by TAIEX actions. These are No's 74-77 and 107 as well as Nos. 78-80 (if their project proposal budgets are reduced to suit TAIEX conditions).

TEMPUS and Erasmus-Mundus.

There is one potential proposal No 16.

CBC programmes

We assume that three current programmes will continue to operate:

- Baltic Sea Region,
- Latvia-Lithuania-Belarus,
- Poland-Belarus-Ukraine.

✓ Baltic Sea Region

The following NP ITC proposals may be submitted for financing through this programme: Nos. 50, 84, 90 and 102.

✓ Latvia-Lithuania-Belarus

The following NP ITC proposals could be financed within this programme: Nos. 5, 23, 28, 37, 39, 40, 43, 48, 83, 94, 95 and 102. Proposal No 42 could also be considered if the ENI CBC programme continues financing large infrastructure projects.

✓ Poland-Belarus-Ukraine

The PBU programme could finance the following NP ITC proposals: Nos. 29, 73, 96, 97, 102, 106, 111, 112, 113 and 114.

Thematic programmes

- Investing in People
Proposals Nos. 2, 18, 21, 22, 67-69.
- Migration and Asylum
Proposal No 30.
- Environment and Sustainable Management of Natural Resources Including Energy
Proposals Nos. 81, 82, 88 and 89.
- Non-State Actors and Local Authorities in Development
Proposals Nos. 07-15, 18 and 60.

Instrument for Nuclear Safety Cooperation (INSC);

Proposals Nos. 31, 54, 66, 87, 99, 100 and 101.

Instrument for Promoting Democracy and Human Rights (IDHR).

Proposal No 63.

6. CONCLUSIONS

1. Thus 102 out of 114 proposals, or 89.5% of the NP ITC project proposals are in line the priorities of the EU instruments. 10 of the remaining 12 are proposals for projects located on the border between Belarus and Ukraine. These types of projects located on the borders of ENP partner-states were not financed in the past by the EU and there is no sign that they will be financed in 2014-2020. Previously only CBC projects on the EU-ENP partner country borders and some projects within the EU CBC programmes for Ukraine-Belarus-Moldova were financed by the EU.

The two remaining project proposals probably fall beyond the remit of international technical assistance. Proposal No 85 'Ex-post Project Analysis for the Khotislav Chalk Deposit in Malorita Region of Brest Oblast' is of a more commercial nature and could probably be implemented through investment mechanism. Proposal No 110 'Production of Special Mixed Fodder for Cattle Grown on Radioactive Polluted Territories' also may not be considered eligible for ITC, because this type of cooperation relates rather to transfer of know-how and experience between partner-states. The EU does not possess such know-how or experience. This proposal may be classified as scientific research and may be financed through the 7th EU Framework Programme.

2. Currently seven NP ITC projects are financed by EU funds (to a total of EUR 20.67 million).

7. RECOMMENDATIONS

1. The National Programme of ITC identifies the needs of Belarus in technical assistance for a five-year period. This is the 3rd ITC National Programme. In its present version it is a set of project proposals grouped by priorities. Project proposals are selected based on proposals from the national central administration bodies, local authorities and other Belarusian organizations. The NP ITC priorities are based on the priorities for social and economic development in the country. In its present form the NP ITC reflects the needs of various organizations and bodies in Belarus but fails to reflect the needs in ITC of the country as a whole. This may be illustrated by the fact that the current version of the NP ITC does not include proposals from such important ministries as, e.g. the Ministry of Economy, the Ministry of Industry, the Ministry of Justice, etc. (see Annex), which are responsible for the development of various branches of the national economy.
2. Donors provide assistance to partner-states in support of their social and economic reforms. This means that the NP ITC must be drafted simultaneously and in line with the Programme of Social and Economic Development of Belarus (PSED) for a five-year period. The current NP ITC covers the period of 2012-2016

and the current PSED – the period of 2011-2015. Donors' assistance should be considered as an additional resource for the country's social and economic reforms. It seems logical that the NP ITC should be directly connected to the Public Investment Programme (PIP), which in turn should serve as an instrument for rational, coordinated and transparent investment programming, as well as a mechanism for locating and selecting social and economic reform agenda projects for donor support.

3. Change would need to be implemented in the drafting of the NP ITC, if it is to properly align external assistance needs, donors' pledges and public investment programming and become a document of real national value.

We would recommend drafting future NP ITC based on a sector approach (SA).

Sector approach: A **sector approach** (or SWAp) is a way of working together between government, development partners and other key sector stakeholders. It is a process aimed at broadening government and national ownership over public sector policy and resource allocation decisions within the sector, increasing the coherence between policy, spending and results, and reducing transaction costs.

Sector development programme (SDP): As a result of following a Sector Approach, a government progressively develops a **sector programme**. Sector programmes are based on three core elements: (i) the sector policy and strategy; (ii) the sector budget and its medium term expenditure perspective and (iii) the sector coordination framework through which the sector strategy, action plans and budget are reviewed and updated. A sector programme may be set out in a set of actions and activities to implement the sector strategy.

A **Sector Support Programme (SSP)** is the donor programme to support the sector programme. The EC's aid instrument for supporting a sector programme is known as a **Sector Policy Support Programme (SPSP)**. The SPSP methodology is an important approach of raising external aid effectiveness mainly through better coordination of sector and institutional development policies.

This is a methodology which brings together the efforts of the Government, donors and ITC beneficiaries. It is based on the Paris Declaration principles of aid effectiveness:

- drafting a unified sector policy (ideally a policy applicable to both private and public sectors, as well as joint realistic Medium-Term Budget Expenditure (MTBE) programme;
 - formalization of the donor coordination process and harmonization of their procedures in the areas of reporting, budget drafting, finance and supplies management;
 - actions to increase the use of local systems for drafting and implementation of programmes, financial management, monitoring and evaluation.
4. To implement such an approach it is necessary to establish Sector Policy Coordination Councils in designated areas of social and economic development in Belarus, for example in the areas defined by the PSED⁷.
 5. The NP ITC should be a 3-year rolling programme updated annually.
